(*John 14:6*) We are celebrating the 25th anniversary of our adopting the Via de Cristo name after several years using the Cursillo name that originated in the Catholic church. We hope to have as many charter members, forefathers, and former National Board officers as possible at this anniversary meeting.

The excitement is mounting as we prepare to be servants to each of you in Christ's name. We have been regularly meeting and have received well over 125 reservations for the July meeting. Application forms are available on the NLS website www.viadecristo.org. Meals are available on Wednesday as noted on the application. Please check any additional meals that you want as reservations are a must for meal preparation by the University.

Our meeting will be at the lovely Queens University of Charlotte (www.queens.edu). The lovely tree-covered campus is located about 15 minutes from the Charlotte Douglas International Airport and near downtown. A committee member will greet you at the airport and welcome you to the Queen city. (This is the only airport from which we can provide transportation.) The dorm rooms share a bathroom with the adjoining room; making no more than four persons sharing. There is no smoking and no alcohol permitted on the campus. The facilities are entirely air-conditioned (necessary in the hot and humid climate). The short walks between events are along tree-lined walkways and on level terrain. Keep in mind that Charlotte can be very warm and humid in the summer. All meetings however, will be held in air-conditioned rooms and may be cool, so you may want to bring a wrap or sweater along with you.

Charlotte is a city of trees and churches and offers many and varied visitor attractions. For those that want to extend their stay, we are convenient to South Carolina beaches which are about 3 and half hours southeast and the beautiful Blue Ridge and Smoky Mountains can be enjoyed 2 hours west.

We encourage members from all Secretariats to send representatives to this year's celebration annual meeting. If funds are an issue for your Secretariat, please contact NLS VP of Outreach, Steve Gielda at sgielda@cox.net regarding possible scholarships. Each year the meeting proves to be a wonderful forum for exchanging information, sharing ideas, making new friends, and renewing old friendships. You will be led, fed, and encouraged while sharing music, worship, the Eucharist, meals, laughter, and God's love with Brothers

and Sisters from all over the United States that have chosen to walk in the "Way of Christ".

On behalf of the entire Western North Carolina Via de Cristo community, we look forward to being your hosts and offer you a heartfelt, "Ya'll come"! We look forward to you joining us in July for some true "Southern hospitality" as we worship and glorify our Precious Savior.

Go and Grow!



God is Good....All the Time....All the Time....God is Good. We hear that phrase often, but do we really believe it in our hearts. Do you live each day knowing that God's plans for your life are sufficient? It's tough some-

times. Each of us face difficult times in our lives. The flooding taking place in the south right now is a real tragedy. Finding God in the midst of despair isn't easy.

Those of you, who attended the National Lutheran Secretariat Meeting in Minnesota last year, may remember my childhood friend and Pastor, Frank Ruffatto. Frank talked about how God called him into the ministry. He talked about the highs and lows he faced while trying to discern God's plan for his life. He talked about the obstacles that were placed in his path. Today, as a Pastor of a mission church, Point of Grace Lutheran Church in Cornelius, NC, he has been dealt another obstacle in his life. His wife Terri has been diagnosed with stage 3 breast cancer. I visited with Frank, Terri and their girls recently. Their faith in God in the midst of this recent and tragic news inspired me. They both are looking at this as just another piece of the puzzle in God's plan for their lives.

Terri has put up a Caring Bridge website to allow her friends and family to follow her progress. In her post of Friday, May 13th, she wrote: *"I have been acutely aware of the sufferings of others this week and that God meant for us to glorify Him by walking together in both the joys and trials of life. Watching others at the cancer center, thinking of my friends who have chronic illnesses, colon cancer, MS, life with amputations, financial struggles, facing unknown job and housing situations, relationship problems, the many people who have lost their homes, friends, and loved ones in the tornadoes, floods, and earthquakes -- some may ask "where is God in all of this, how can we possibly see Him as loving in the midst of suffering?" The verse that comes to mind is from Romans 8:31-39: "What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? As it is written: "For your sake we face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am con-*

vinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Brothers and sisters of God, despite the obstacles we may be facing in our life, He is calling you to **"Go and Grow"**. He is calling you continue on your path of discipleship and to bring others to Christ. He is calling you to use those obstacles in your life as palanca, a lever to lift and inspire others to keep going.

There are many Pastors and churches in our own backyard that have never heard of Via de Cristo or any other part of the Cursillo method. We've all seen the power God has provided when pilgrims become Christian Leaders in their own churches. We have seen the power of the Holy Spirit move a congregation from a stagnate to a growing fruitful church. God is calling you to share the news of Via de Cristo to those Pastors and neighbors in your area. We are all busy; we all have obstacles in our lives, but He is calling each of us to do our part, to share the gift of Cursillo and this Via de Cristo movement to others.

When you are beginning to feel defeated remember what is stated in Psalm 73:26 "God is the strength of our heart". Max Lucado wrote this short devotion that I think is appropriate. *"God is for you. Turn to the sidelines; that's God cheering your run. Look past the finish line; that's God applauding your steps. Listen for Him in the bleachers, shouting your name. Too tired to continue? He'll carry you. Too discouraged to fight? He's picking you up. God is for you."*

I am looking forward seeing many of you at the National Lutheran Secretariat meeting in Charlotte, NC in July. If you have never attended NOW is your time to go!

Dear Bill,

I have known you for several years. And just wanted to take this time to thank you for your friendship over these years. When we moved to Florida in 1986 you found us and befriended us, although we had met some years before that, when we became missionaries in 1965. We met at times at presbytery meetings.



And then came the time you told me about Via de Cristo. I had never been aware of such a thing. You sponsored Martha and me for Weekend #14 of Sonbeam Via de Cristo. That was in November 1989, when the Berlin Wall was falling and things were changing everywhere. They changed for us too. From you it was the first time I heard words like "Rollo" and "Ultreya" and "Palanca." What interesting words, I thought to myself. And what fun that weekend was! Not long after that I was invited to serve as spiritual director for a weekend. Then came the times when we served together on weekends as spiritual directors. It sure was a pleasure to serve with you!

I remember the time you asked me if I would like to be spiritual director for Sonbeam. I remember replying that if we could do it together, I would. So we did, and so Sonbeam now had two spiritual directors. You were a joy to work with. If one of us could not be present at a meeting, the other could. There were times when we could complete each other's sentences. We were true partners in ministry. Inevitably we got into the same reunion group of ministers. We met once a month in various places, ending up at a Cracker Barrel! We shared. We talked. We prayed with and for each other. We saw each other in the hospitals. We were like brothers together.

With both of us failing in health, we both "retired" from being spiritual directors of Sonbeam. The day came when we entered into our "bucket bet," by which we had a "bet" by which we would race to see who got to "kick the bucket" first. We laughed about that for many months. And we talked about "time" in heaven. Your comment was that time would have no meaning. That answered a question I had. You won that bet, Bill. You have always been a winner, in faith, life, and love! And the day will come when by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ the rest of us will join you in the "house with many rooms." Make sure you have a good party for us!

PALANCA Praying with Confidence

Lately during my time reading His Word and supporting books and articles the subject of praying with confidence has bubbled up. During our prayer time connecting with God when there are problems or we have feelings of disappointment seems difficult.

“... The effective prayer of a righteous man can accomplish much.” James 5:16 (NASV) In Praying with Confidence, David C Egner, Author and Teacher, suggests 5 principles to consider as we pray 1) How we approach God 2) Openly share our feelings 3) Truly listen to God 4) Accept God’s perspective and 5) Offer God praise and thanksgiving.

In relation to the verse above from James, Corey Naquin, Pastor - Covenant Church, in an article entitled “Prayer that Works” discusses the word effective. Effective means to produce the desired result. In the NKJV translation the word fervent also appears which means marked with great intensity.

Both of these readings remind me that my attitude in prayer is key. John 15:7 says “But if you make yourselves at home with me and my words are at home in you, you can be sure that whatever you ask will be listened to and acted upon.” (The Message) The NASV translation uses the word “abide”. Abide is a powerful word that means to endure without yielding. When I consider that kind of endurance, confidence comes to mind. The sort of confidence that provides a peace that prayers are heard and God has promised to act upon them. While the actions God takes may not always be exactly what we would hope, our accepting his perspective and offering praise and thanksgiving for His listening would be appropriate.

Position: National Coordinator

The National Coordinator will be employed full time by National Lutheran Secretariat (NLS) under the direction of the NLS Board to represent Via de Cristo in public relations and to coordinate the operations of the organization.

Purpose:

The National Coordinator is a responsible servant of Jesus Christ who wishes to Glorify God through the coordination and promotion of Via de Cristo.

Qualifications:

1. Be in an active 4th Day Community including Reunion Group and Ultreya within a Lutheran home congregation.
2. Have a servant spirit, and be committed to prayer.
3. Have good office skills: computer, database. Internet, fax, etc.
4. Have minimal accounting skills.
5. Be willing to work under the direction of the NLS Board.
6. Have good communication skills.
7. Have good organizational skills, including the abilities to prioritize, manage time, and to motivate and utilize volunteers.

Salary: Negotiable

Evaluation:

Initially reviewed after 90 days, 180 days and then annually by the NLS Board.

General Responsibilities:

Serves as a contact, resource and information person. Handles public relations and functions as communications coordinator with the 4th Day community, the NLS Board, other Fourth Day Movements, and the national Lutheran Church bodies. Coordinates preparation and maintenance of all computer records.

Specific Responsibilities:

1. Responds to all inquiries (mail, telephone, e-mail, etc.) received in the national office and sends out information as needed. Coordinates with the NLS Board a response to inquiries regarding new movements. Is available to speak and disseminate VdC information at forums, conferences and other Christian gatherings, and provide necessary follow-up.
2. Works under the direction of the NLS Board, attending Board meetings and participating in all conference calls.
 - a. Provides reports on activities.
 - b. Assists the Board President in planning meeting agendas.
 - c. Brings to the attention of the Board all articles and public issues regarding VdC for consideration and follow-up.
 - d. Serves as an Advisory (non-voting) member of the Board.

3. Establishes and maintains regular contact with all local Lay Directors:
 - a. To insure current rosters of local Secretariat members.
 - b. To assist Secretariats in need of direction and advice.
 - c. To maintain an up-to-date schedule of weekends for general publication.
 - d. To insure prompt signing of documents, submission of statistical reports, and payment of annual fees from the secretariats.
4. Recruits volunteer help as needed.
5. Provides follow-up through guidelines set by the NLS Board and National Lutheran Secretariat to see that guidelines are followed.
6. Works with the NLS Spiritual Director on matters concerning pastoral issues and functions.
7. Provides web master with current information.
8. Maintains duplicates of manuals, educational, liaison and promotional materials in conjunction with the Coordinator of the Distribution Center.
9. Is authorized to purchase supplies at the best price or up to a maximum limit established by the NLS Board.
10. Supplies the Data Entry person with address changes and updates as received from the local secretariats.
11. Maintains a chronological record of Board motions and action items.
12. Under the direction of the Board Treasurer:
 - a. Forwards all monies received to the Board Treasurer.
 - b. Makes duplicate records for the office and for the Board Treasurer.
 - c. Sends acknowledgments for all gifts, monetary and otherwise.
13. Stores all records.
14. Provides an annual report to the National Lutheran Secretariat's Annual Meeting.

Leadership Training Retreat

Greetings fellow brothers and sisters in Christ,

We would like to share with you information about the Leadership Training Retreat held by the Northern Light Via de Cristo. Northern Light, which was started in 2006, serves Northern Wisconsin and Upper Michigan. Our weekend events are held at various camps. The November 5-7, 2010 Training Retreat was no different and was held at Silver Birch Ranch located near White Lake, WI.

The Training Retreat idea began at our October, 2009 Council meeting. Some of the Northern Light community had attended the national meetings and realized the importance of getting the team members trained properly. Normally, we hold two weekend events a year, spring and fall. We voted to cancel our normal fall VDC weekend and hold a special Leadership Training Retreat. We thought it would be a great way for us to promote the importance of Leadership Training and provide an opportunity to help build team unity. The first draft for the outline of the weekend was presented and approved at our January, 2010 Council meeting. A team to help plan the Training Retreat was formed and from there we were off and running.

The event was planned to begin on Friday evening and end by noon on Sunday morning. As we planned the weekend, we first and foremost wanted to gather to praise our Awesome God. We were very pleased that a local praise band, House of Grace, agreed to attend the entire Training Retreat weekend, to help enhance our Worship Services. Worship Services were held Friday evening, Saturday morning, Saturday evening and Sunday morning.

We would certainly encourage other Secretariats to consider having a Leadership Training Retreat. It was a great weekend filled with Praising God, leadership training, fellowship and lots of fun. If you hold such an event, we highly recommend that you invite members from our National Board to participate. It was so beneficial having Tracy, Pastor Paul and Nancy with us.

CONFERENCE CALL — April 10, 2011

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m. Sunday, April 10th. Present were Tracy Schmidlin, Steve Gielda, Steve Barnett, Katie Sistar, Pr. Doug Givan, Carolyn Hawkins, Judy Laabs-Foss, Pr. Larry Conway, Diane Purcell. Pr. Larry opened with prayer.

Vice President of Administration: Carolyn gave an update on the Host Committee's preparations for the Annual Meeting and number registered so far.

We discussed the times the Board needed to arrive in Charlotte and what to do about eating before we meet. We went over the vendors' policy reiterating that we have a non-compete contract with Symbols Inc., and vendors should not be a distraction for the weekend. The NLS logo is just for the Host team to use.

The Host Team has contacted Thrivent and arranged two additional fundraisers. They received a \$3000 gift from a congregation in the region.

Secretary: Katie reported that we still have 6 secretariats that have not sent back a signed affiliation form and 3 that do not have a Spiritual Director on their secretariat. Only 19 secretariats have sent the survey information regarding the number of weekends held and the number of pilgrims and new clergy attending for 2010. The ones who haven't responded will be receiving another request for their secretariat's information.

Treasurer: Steve B. reported that we have received \$2245 in current dues and \$2445 in past year's dues. He has been trying to get the current officers' list updated so he can correspond with the treasurers adequately.

Vice President of Outreach: Steve G. stated that no new groups are ready to affiliate. He had a good response from the Wellness Checklist. Half the secretariats have let him know that the Wellness Chart has been completed, and three have asked for help. The Board is glad to see that people know we are here to help when needed. We discussed who might be asked to lead the truth seminar since Victor Lugo now has a time conflict. We discussed the need for Regional Representatives to be a committee under Steve's supervision. We want the Body to know that their input is welcome in helping to form the committee.

Spiritual Director: Doug asked for prayer requests and health updates from the Board members. He has sent invitations to Bishops and Spiritual Directors to come to the annual meeting in Charlotte. He stated that he had sent out information and requests for meditations for the Devotional Booklet and got only a few additional responses. The Devotional Booklet is nearly completed.

Newsletter Editor: Judy needs labels for the Conexiones. A new Newsletter will go out after May 15, and new updated labels are needed. Jim had volunteered to take the job for one year so we will need a new person in the Database position also.

Financial Advisor: Diane encourages everyone to get their filing for the government done this year. She has been helping a secretariat with their constitution and bylaws to reorganize corporate-wise.

Web Page Coordinator: Larry has done updates for the locator for Information and Videos. He has added a web page for Archives. Under Archives, there is a section to click for Videos. We want people to know that videos are on line and how to find them.

Old Business: We further discussed the need for nominating committee members and what offices need to be filled this summer. The elected officer positions available at the 2011 annual meeting are President, Secretary and Vice President of Outreach. We have two appointed offices that we are looking to fill: Database Coordinator and Web Page Coordinator.

We discussed the lack of progress in funding a National Coordinator position, and brainstormed on possible alternatives to this challenge. *Diane moved that the NLS Board take a motion to the National Body to fill the position of a Volunteer National Coordinator until such time as funding can be procured. Carolyn 2nd. Motion passed.* Discussion centered on the fact that the position *is needed* even though funding is not readily available. The board recommends that expenses for this position be considered and dis-

cussed at the next NLSAM. The job description would be given out and those interested in the position would be interviewed at the National Meeting. If approved by the body, a committee of Board and non-board members would be established at the NLSAM to handle interviews of interested parties and the application process for the Volunteer National Coordinator.

We need to complete the History Book that will be given out at the NLSAM. There are ten secretariats that have not responded with updated history. Board members were given names in secretariats to call to help with the effort of getting the data to Ron Millard in time for it to be included in the History Book. We discussed the size and cost related to this project and agreed on a design for the cover page.

The National Executive Board has adopted a travel policy regarding reimbursement for travel expenses for people doing NLS work serving on the N.L.S. board. It's in the President's Administration Book and the Secretary's records.

Diane moved that Tracy and Steve B. have authority to open a Thrivent account with Thrivent Financial Bank and that they be authorized signers. Katie 2nd. Motion passed.

We reviewed the contact list of past officers we are inviting to attend NLSAM in July.

Carolyn closed with prayer at 10:20 p.m.
