President Report

De Colores Via de Cristo Community!

I recently attended the men’s closing for a Good News Weekend– it was great! Twenty-seven “on fire” men shared from the heart what Christ had done for them over the previous 72 hours. It was easy to feel the fires that were ignited by the Holy Spirit. Tom said he felt like he had been stripped down and then reassembled. Jason, who hales from a Church of the Nazarene, paraphrased a playful song sung on the weekend by saying he felt “drop-kicked by Jesus through the goal posts of life.” He continued to effervesce “God’s grace abounds, it is overwhelming.” Another man shared “I received a fresh look at grace; the power of prayer was so very evident.” Everyone there seemed moved when one gentleman said he learned that he could truly “bag all his garbage and lay it at the feet of Jesus – then go out to serve.”

You may not know Tom or Jason or any of the other guys I listened to, but I am sure you have heard similar things at your own closings. Closings are an essential part of the weekend, because it is the real “send off” back into the world. Our Via de Cristo movement touches the whole Church and inspires leaders all across the nation. It is encouraging to me to know that so many are prepared to enter their 4th day equipped to serve our Lord. Can I challenge you to think on the meaning and purpose of the 4th day? And how continuing to be equipped is critical not only to your personal life, but to the life of the movement? What is it you are doing in your 4th day? What tools and techniques did you learn on your weekend that you are carrying on?

Remember, the only purpose of the Weekend is to prepare for 4th day living. We all know that when we focus on the Weekends the entire movement suffers. I remember reading in our Essential Manual how difficult it can be to get new participants to focus on 4th day rather than the Weekend. Everyone is so excited by the weekend that they want everyone they love to have the experience (focus on weekend). They sponsor family and friends to attend (focus on the weekend). But unless they get actively involved in changing their personal environments (focus on the 4th day) and get active in Reunion and Ul-treya (focus on 4th day) the enthusiasm can too quickly fade and Via de Cristo becomes just another thing to do. Very little happens to promote growth within Christ’s Church.

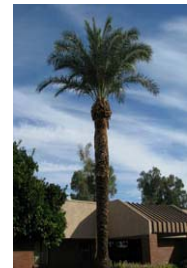

Rev. John Propst opened with prayer.

Web Page Coordinator Report – Bob Northrup

Everything on the web has been updated and is in good shape. Tracy thanked him for the updates. He will be stepping down from this position in July. After his report, he had to leave the meeting.

Secretary Report – Katie Sistar

The approved Teleconference Minutes from September 16, 2007 are on the web and in the Newsletter. The Mid-Year Minutes from meeting in Arizona are also on the web and in the Newsletter.

The updated 2008 NLS Survey has been sent to all the Lay Directors and Presidents of the secretariats with a requested response by March 15. Thanks to Jan Long and Lucy Hightower for their assistance in getting this ready.

Treasurer Report – Jerry Lemcke

Letters will be sent to the treasurers of each secretariat requesting the National dues which need to be paid by May. Jerry has served four years and will step down in July.

VP Administration Report – Nu Helgager

Bishop Steve Talmage is confirmed as Keynote Speaker for the National Meeting. The host committee is meeting monthly now and will be sending out invitations to the secretariats with letters and registration and travel forms.

Reviewed the contract with Florida for the 2009 National Meeting.

VP Outreach Report – Dave Erdman

Steve Gilda is working with Region 5 to develop a new secretariat in Pennsylvania. Region to Region last summer helped with this process. There is a request in Delaware for information on how to get started. There is a request from Texas for Spanish materials.

Dave and Pastor John would like to assist Heart of Florida with VDC information before their retreat on February 22, 23 at which the secretariat will discuss their Via de Cristo plans.

There are 2 day programs which are not Via de Cristo but which serve a similar purpose. They are CHIRP and Discovery.

Spiritual Director Report – Pastor John Propst

Everything is fine. He will see if Arizona needs any help with the worship schedule. John will be stepping down in July.

Newsletter Editor Report – Judy Laabs-Foss

The newsletter is posted and the next deadline for articles is April 15. She wrote an article about insurance. The National organization is not attached to the local secretariats, so it is important that each group obtains its own insurance for their weekends.

Report from Fourth Day Movement – Tracy Schmidlin

This was a meeting of groups similar to Via de Cristo in 10 or more states who gathered in Florida on Feb. 1 and 2 to discuss ways of strengthening all of us. Different groups are trying to do the same thing in bringing the good news of Christ to people. We are having similar struggles. We need to recognize each other's weekends and be willing to share materials. There is a need for more volunteers in Kairos. That ministry needs to be promoted more.

Old Business –

The National Coordinator position is on hold right now. The committee has not met yet. We discussed

the process of getting a National Coordinator. There is concern that not enough money was authorized at last summer's National meeting to fund a major campaign to fund the position in perpetuity. There was a discussion of who might be able to be in the position initially and how they would be paid. We agreed that we want the National Coordinator position to work out, so Joe Nilsen and Bob Quam should move forward with the committee work.

New Business –

Eduardo Bonin, a founder of Cur-sillo, died recently at the age of 90.

Tracy is working on getting a nominating committee for the openings in July.

The next teleconference meeting is scheduled for 7:00 EDT on April 6.

Spiritual Director's Report

"Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. God is spirit and His worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth." (John 4:23-24 from Today's NIV)

Dear Via de Cristo Friends,

Via de Cristo is not a Church. It is a movement within the Church that the Holy Spirit uses to strengthen members within the local congregation. We hear this many times on weekends. And it is so true.

If VdC impacts the local worshipper at all, I believe it enables the kind of worship that Jesus talked about in John 4 with the Samaritan woman at the well. I love this dialogue with the woman, don't you?

Soren Kierkegaard, a Lutheran theologian in the early 1800's, said that in worship there are three components: prompters, actors & the audience. Pastors, song leaders and others are the prompters; folks in the congregation are the actors; AND God is the audience! *Ummm...*instead of critiquing the sermon or choice of hymns/songs on the way out after worship, we might want to ask God, *"How did I do today, God? Was my heart in worship? Were You the recipient of my praise?"* Ahhhh....we should applaud God loud and often, writes Max Lucado in his book, "Cure for the Common Life." For our sake, we need to do that. And for heaven's sake, He deserves it. Even if we felt it did nothing for our souls one Sunday morning, it would still be right to do it. God warrants our worship.

I believe that worshipping God *"in the Spirit and in truth"* means that we offer our best to God with thunderous standing ovations! Spiritual worship places God on center stage. I think that this is one of many things I appreciate about Via de Cristo. And my worship "taste buds" are already anticipating the sweet aroma of corporate worship with folks from all around the country at the NLS Annual Meeting at Grand Canyon University in Phoenix in July.

May our Lord Jesus receive plenty of standing ovations as we gather to worship Him in the Spirit and in truth!

REGIONAL MEETINGS

REGION SIX — 2nd ANNUAL Secretariat Retreat

Twenty-eight people attended the 2008 regional meeting, representing four secretariats: Eastern North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Western North Carolina. The meeting was held at Lutheridge, a Lutheran facility in Arden, NC.

The theme was "Moving Onward in Faith – 4th Day Accountability." The verse was Hebrews 12:2-3: "Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinful men, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart." Hebrews 12:2-3 from *Today's NIV*

The first forum focused on the strengthening the Fourth day. Attendees were divided into two groups for discussion. Main points that came from this discussion were:

- Let pilgrims have palanca bags longer
- Have a demonstration of a reunion group during the Ultreyas
- Emphasize it is a sponsor's responsibility to mentor pilgrims
- Post list of reunion groups at church
- Mini ultreyas soon after the weekend
- Fourth day couple at Closura
- Pastor encouragement
- Service projects within reunion groups
- Table professors responsible for contacting pilgrims/babe chicks from their table and invite them to Ultreya and follow-up about reunion groups
- Dominant professor mails group picture to people from their table with a note
- Post weekend secretariat member contacts new Cursillistas to get information on their reunion groups
- Have mock reunion groups at Ultreya
- 4th day community from particular church or region have mini-ultreya for follow-up on forming reunion groups
- Have sign-up sheets for people to join existing reunion groups at Ultreya
- Sponsor your own reunion group
- Reunion by phone
- Have a renewal weekend
- Focal point in churches to coordinate and keep-up with inactive people from 4th day
- Prayer vigil sponsored by reunion group

The second forum was a music forum conducted by Connie Woolard. All those in attendance received information that was helpful to being a music cha.

The third forum was a meeting of the officers. The

group divided into two areas: Main officers (president, lay leader, vice president, secretary, treasurer) and operating/support officers. Ideas from this group include:

- Keep the movement pure
- Don't box the Holy Spirit in
- Encourage pastor involvement
- Mini-weekend for pastors and key lay leaders
- Email newsletters (save stamps)
- Outreach – letters to pastors in the area, forum for pastors
- Visit congregations with new video
- Show video at Synod Assembly
- Coordinate weekend dates within secretariat/location
- Share palanca for prayer banner, get inactive people involved

There was an evaluation time. Ideas included:

- Go a little longer on Saturday, have lighter stuff on Friday night
- Outreach as a theme for 2009
- Training for 2009
- Renewal within congregations
- 4th day weekend
- Care and feeding of SD's

The retreat was closed with worship and communion.
